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"Melchizedek King of Salem" Genesis 14:1-24 1/03/21

Q1. In verse 12, "They also took Lot, Abram's brother's son who dwelt in Sodom, and his goods, and departed," what is Lot's character and its cost? And what can we learn from here?

Q2. In verse 18, "Then Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; he *was* the priest of God Most High," what does it mean? And explain the relationship between Melchizedek and Jesus in the Scripture?

Q3. In verse 23, "that I *will take* nothing, from a thread to a sandal strap, and that I will not take anything that *is* yours, lest you should say, 'I have made Abram rich'," what is Abram's character? And what can we learn from here?

(Background for Daily Bible Reading and Studying Weekly Book Basis)

Abram moved from Ur of the Chaldean, Haran, to Canaan land with Egypt. (Gen 11:31-32) And Terah took his son Abram and his grandson Lot, the son of Haran, and his daughter-in-law Sarai, his son Abram's wife, and they went out with them from Ur of the Chaldeans to go to the land of Canaan; and they came to Haran and dwelt there. ³² So the days of Terah were two hundred and five years, and Terah died in Haran; (Gen 12:1, 8, 11)¹Now the LORD had said to Abram: "Get out of your country, From your family And from your father's house, To a land that I will show you.⁸ And he moved from there to the mountain east of Bethel, and he pitched his tent *with* Bethel on the west and Ai on the east; there he built an altar to the LORD and called on the name of the LORD.¹¹ And it came to pass, when he was close to entering Egypt, that he said to Sarai his wife, "Indeed I know that you *are* a woman of beautiful countenance."; (Gen 13:12) Abram dwelt in the land of Canaan, and Lot dwelt in the cities of the plain and pitched *his* tent even as far as Sodom.

Abram settled in Hebron of the Canaan land:

(Gen 13:18) Then Abram moved *his* tent, and went and dwelt by the terebinth trees of Mamre, which *are* in Hebron, and built an altar there to the LORD.

The Canaanites and the Perizzites then dwelt in the land.⁸ So Abram said to Lot, "Please let there be no strife between you and me, and between my herdsmen and your herdsmen; for we *are* brethren.⁹ *Is* not the whole land before you? Please separate from me. If *you take* the left, then I will go to the right; or, if *you go* to the right, then I will go to the left."¹⁰ And Lot lifted his eyes and saw all the plain of Jordan, that it *was* well watered everywhere (before the LORD destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah) like the garden of the LORD, like the land of Egypt as you go toward Zoar. ¹¹ Then Lot chose for himself all the plain of Jordan, and Lot journeyed east. And they separated from each other. ¹² Abram dwelt in the land of Canaan, and Lot dwelt in the cities of the plain and pitched *his* tent even as far as Sodom. ¹³ But the men of Sodom *were* exceedingly wicked and sinful against the LORD.

No one comes to the Father except through me; 1 Peter 2:9 But you *are* a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light;
