Q1. In 16:3-4, "Then the king said, 'And where *is* your master's son?' And Ziba said to the king, 'Indeed he is staying in Jerusalem, for he said, Today the house of Israel will restore the kingdom of my father to me', <sup>4</sup> So the king said to Ziba, 'Here, all that belongs to Mephibosheth *is* yours.' And Ziba said, 'I humbly bow before you, *that* I may find favor in your sight, my lord, O king!" whether or not Ziba's statement was true in the Scripture? And what can we learn from David's statement?

Q2. In 16:11-12, "And David said to Abishai and all his servants, 'See how my son who came from my own body seeks my life. How much more now *may this* Benjamite? Let him alone, and let him curse; for so the LORD has ordered him. <sup>12</sup> It may be that the LORD will look on my affliction, and that the LORD will repay me with good for his cursing this day," what do these mean in the context? And how can we apply these to our lives?

Q3. In 17:14, "So Absalom and all the men of Israel said, 'The advice of Hushai the Archite *is* better than the advice of Ahithophel.' For the LORD had purposed to defeat the good advice of Ahithophel, to the intent that the LORD might bring disaster on Absalom," what does it mean in the context? And what can we learn from here?.

(Background for context of this text on Daily Bible Reading and Studying Weekly Book Basis)

In the last time, 2 Samuel 15:37, "So Hushai, David's friend, went into the city. And Absalom came into Jerusalem," upon Absalom the 3<sup>rd</sup> son's rebellion against David, David worshipped at the top of the mount of Olives; And he set up 5 spies for the chain of messages– (1) Hushai as a counselor of Absalom to defeat the counsel of Ahithophel, it became true later, (2) Zadok and Abiathar the priests as recipients of any messages from Hushai at the palace ruled by Absalom, and (3) Ahimaaz and Jonathan the sons of the priests as the deliverers of the messages or messengers from the priests; And so David has been reported after Absalom came into Jerusalem.

Today, we'd like to see two chapters 16 & 17:

16:1-4: The dishonesty of Ziba the Mephibosheth's servant 16: 5-14: Shimei's curse to David

16: 15-23: Ahithophel's Advice for Absalom in Jerusalem

17:1-14: Advices of Ahithophel and Hushai 17:15-29: Hushai's Message Delivered To David

Further, for the application, a life or spiritual experience might be helpful to understand how to apply an understood word in the text column, but it is temperately used like Paul, because nobody should think above that literal experience (2 Cor 12:6, Jer 23:28; Ne 8:8).


### Pray for Abandoned children in Ukraine and His increase



I cannot live with myself knowing this is going on, and I am willing to spend the rest of my life protecting and caring for those who do not have the ability to protect and care for themselves.

I have always thought that if I reached an age when I was too old to travel, I would enjoy restoring a classic car. I enjoy watching shows that take an old car that is a wreck and bring it back to life. Truthfully, I would enjoy having a garage with half a dozen cars that I could slowly restore. Watching shows that bring a wreck back to a

thing of beauty reminds me of how the Lord takes broken lives and restores them. But would far more desire to save these children and set up places of refuge for the handicapped and children of all ages, including babies and toddlers. Please understand we plan on starting what does not



exist in Ukraine, and when we find children who are being abused by parents, we will not allow it to continue. When the laws of the land do not protect women and children, we, as believers, answer to a higher law, God's law, and will do what is necessary to ensure these children are not harmed by parents or anyone, such as a boyfriend.

In March of last year, we wrote about children who were being sexually abused in Central and South America, and I was truly stunned by how the body of Christ responded. It was far beyond what I ever expected. Because the response was so tremendous, many children are being rescued, but now we need people to come alongside and help us build the infrastructure to save children in Ukraine. You can sign up for a monthly amount of whatever you feel led to give. It could be \$25, \$50, \$75 or \$100. And if you can give far more because of how God has blessed you, we welcome the gift and assure you that these funds will be used solely for this project. I want to let you know that as we begin this project, we cannot send you a biography and photo of a specific child. Once we have children in our care, we will send you information about a child for whom you can pray. So please consider joining us in the rescue of these children.

Hopefully, in time, we will have the ability to facilitate adoptions. It would be my heart's desire that the homes would be a place of love until we can find a family that will care for these children.



Folks, I have some investments that should bring a great return in the next couple of years, and if the Lord blesses I will willingly give it to care for these children.

The Bible says in Psalm 68:5-6 that He is a father to the fatherless and sets the lonely in families.

We will actively seek to follow every lead to find the children who are abandoned and abused. A few years ago, a couple was arrested, and when the police came, they found that the couple had a little girl. When the officers asked her what her name was, she responded, "Stupid." The child had a black eye and deep-purple

God could deliver him. Ismail said that if God can heal me from this, He is real, and I will follow him and he did.

In one particular battle Ismail was in, his unit was being attacked by 700 Islamic enemy soldiers and his unit had only 100 men. His unit was told to attack even though they were greatly outnumbered, but he said, "Today is Sunday. Let us pray this whole day and seek our God that He will be with us." So, all the soldiers spent the



day in prayer. The next day, Ismail took his artillery gun and fired seven shots; all seven hit critical enemy positions, and within a few minutes, the enemy was in full retreat leaving the area and did not return. The men spent the day giving thanks to the Lord for His deliverance. Ismail was known for

many great feats of heroism, once capturing 16 enemy soldiers and three trucks full of military supplies. On another occasion, his position was hit by a surface-toair missile (SAM) that killed over 100 soldiers and 30 civilians. Once again, Ismail escaped uninjured, and the people said it was because of his relationship with Christ that he was delivered.

I am at the chaplain base as this letter is being written. We sent for Ismail's wife to be brought from the Nuba Mountains to the base. We will do our best to comfort her in her grief and give her the stipend that we give for each fallen chaplain, which can take care of her for years.

Ismail was around 55 years of age and served in the war for 37 years. In his life, he had brought many men and



women to Christ. He had planted a church in a radical Muslim area where the people were some of the most violent, but to this day, his church is still alive with over 200 converted Muslims.

He never knew the comforts of this world but will know great peace throughout eternity, having given his all to protect his people and serve Christ.
