### "Onesimus" Philemon 1:1-25 5/14/23

- Q1. In verse 4, "I thank my God, making mention of you always in my prayers," what does it mean? And how can we apply it to our lives?
- Q2. In verse 12, "I am sending him back. You therefore receive him, that is, my own heart," what does it mean in the context? and what can we learn from here?
- Q3. In verse 16, "no longer as a slave but more than a slave—a beloved brother, especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord," what does it mean in the context? and what can we learn from here?

(Background for context of this text on Daily Bible Reading and Studying Weekly Book Basis)

During 58-63 AD Paul the house arrestee's 4<sup>th</sup> mission trip (Acts 21:17-28:31), Paul wrote this personal letter to Philemon at the Colossian church in 61 AD. Philemon was saved through the Paul's ministry. Onesimus the slave was owned by Philemon the master. Onesimus had run away from Philemon to Rome, where Paul met him to have been saved. Here, Paul convinced Philemon about the forgiveness of Onesimus as a brother in Christ.

(Acts 28:30-31) "Then Paul dwelt two whole years in his own rented house, and received all who came to him, <sup>31</sup> preaching the kingdom of God and teaching the things which concern the Lord Jesus Christ with all confidence, no one forbidding him."

#### <sup>1</sup> Paul, <u>a prisoner of Christ Jesus</u>, and <u>Timothy our brother</u>, <u>To</u> <u>Philemon</u> our <u>beloved friend</u> and fellow laborer,

#### Inductive **Explanation** in context & syntax

1= ...a prisoner of Christ Jesus....Timothy our brother, To Philemon ...beloved friend and fellow laborer (During Paul's ministry for Christ's sake in Jerusalem, he was arrested by the commander through the whole crowd stirred up by the Jews from Asia; So, Paul doesn't consider himself a prisoner of Rome, but a prisoner of Jesus Christ; Timothy was saved through Paul's ministry, called as "a true son in the faith." Every Christian is a brother or a sister in Christ; Paul and Timothy sent this letter to Philemon their co-minister Acts 21:27, 33; 1 Tim 1:1; James 2:15¹)

2=...Apphia, Archippus, to the church in your house (Also to the others -- Apphia might be the wife of Philemon; Archippus was a minister at Colossian church that was in the house of Philemon; the church was likely founded by Epaphras the word minister; In the early church time, various believers met in various houses to worship in spirit and truth, becoming various churches the body of Christ; Every church is the Lord's church purchased with His blood. *Col 4:17; Col 1:7; Rom 16:5; 1 Cor*

So church ministry seeks souls/beings, not possessions the potential dispute among people. if you feel uncomfortable to use the possessive forms because of potential misunderstanding the possessive forms, tolerate them for the unity of the body of Christ on the earth; So, we tolerate disputable things such as "fortunately, rather than sadly or tragically," "proud of a person, not of God," "a woman pastor," "a sprinkling rather than water baptism," "infant baptism rather than dedication," "sabbath year to a minister, not to land," "minister's retirement by tradition, not by God," etc. because we speak the word of God as of sincerity, as from God, and in the sight of God by meditating whatever things are pure and lovely Tit 3:9; 2 Cor 2:17; Phil 4:8⁴ And if anything is against God or Scripture, simply cast it down/ disregard it, e.g., human thoughts, opinions, or various denominational systematic theologies – these things are not man-made-frames over God or Scripture but mere means or references to understand God or Scripture the substance 2 Cor 10:5⁵)

- <sup>3</sup> <u>Grace</u> to you and <u>peace</u> from <u>God</u> <u>our Father and the Lord Jesus</u> <u>Christ.</u>
- <sup>4</sup>I <u>thank my God</u>, making mention of you <u>always in my prayers</u>,
- 3= Grace....peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ..... (Grace and peace is the proper order because you will never have true peace in Christ until you really discover the grace of God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ for eternal salvation the Greek, CHARIS, combines with the Hebrew, SHALOM)
- 4=Q1 ..thank my God....always in my prayers (Prayer is your communication with God through Jesus in fellowship/communion. So always in prayer or prayer without ceasing does not merely a request but also worshipping, thanks, confession, or faith in the Spirit, like the talk between Abba

5= hearing of your love and faith...toward the Lord Jesus...toward all the saints (Paul heard how Philemon loved the Lord and the brothers and sisters in the body of Christ; The faith in God or His word, not in your inner feeling for the uncertain future which you say -- called as the word of faith; You may express your faith by doing God's word applicable wherever the Lord opens, with given free will and given ability, for His glory or His good pleasure James 4:14-15; Luke 14:28-30; Phil 2:13; Rom 10:17; Rev 3:7)

6=...the sharing of your faith...become effective by ..acknowledgement of every good thing in you in Christ Jesus (You may effectuate your faith by sharing good things with others, as you recognize every good thing in Christ Jesus; When we are walking/ living in Christ Jesus, we can do every good thing according to His abundant mercy 1 Peter 1:3; Phil 4:138)

7=....great joy ....consolation in your love ... hearts [bowels] of the saints...refreshed by you (To hear of your love gives us great joy and comfort because your agape love has refreshed the saints' hearts or bowels – inner invisible deep feeling, mind, soul, or spirit. Note the Invisible thing!, not visible thing, for bowels or today hearts.)

8=...though ....very bold in Christ to command [enjoin] you...what...fitting(Apostle, elder, deacon, or pastor's authority is within Christ or His word. Whatever the leadership exercises outside of the given authority, it would be rebuked by the Lord like Judas Iscariot the Apostle; Now, tragically, in many churches, where the leadership loves to exercise authority, like the scribes and the Pharisees in Moses' seat, fleshly issues such as power struggle or division often come out. Here, Paul as an apostle, could have exercised boldly an authority within Christ to order Philemon to forgive Onesimus as a Christian brother. But in verse 9 *Mat 10:1-4, 7; Mat 28:18; Mat 23:2, 11-129*)

- <sup>9</sup> <u>yet for love's sake</u> I <u>rather</u> <u>appeal to you</u>—being such a one as <u>Paul, the aged</u>, and now also <u>a</u> prisoner of Jesus Christ—
- <sup>10</sup> I <u>appeal to you for my</u> <u>son Onesimus, whom I have</u> begotten *while* in my chains,
- <sup>11</sup> who once <u>was unprofitable to you</u>, but <u>now is profitable to you</u> and to me.
- <sup>12</sup>I am <u>sending him back. You</u> therefore <u>receive him</u>, that is, <u>my</u> <u>own heart</u>,
- <sup>13</sup> whom I <u>wished to keep with me</u>, that <u>on your behalf</u> he might <u>minister to me in my chains for the gospel</u>.
- <sup>14</sup> But <u>without your consent</u> I wanted to <u>do nothing</u>, that <u>your good deed</u> might <u>not be by compulsion</u>, as it were, but <u>voluntary</u>.

- 9= yet for love's sake.....rather appeal to you ...Paul, as the aged...a prisoner of Jesus Christ (But I as an old man and prisoner for Jesus Christ's sake request it to you humbly for agape love's sake, as Jesus taught the original apostles and hated the power hierarchy between leadership and non-leadership, Nicolaitans. *Rev* 2:6<sup>10</sup>)
- 10= ...appeal to you for my son Onesimus, whom I have begotten while in my chains (Paul requests Philemon about his spiritual son Onesimus like Timothy or Titus. Onesimus was saved through Paul's ministry in the prison at Rome. Now Onesimus is a faithful and beloved brother in Christ. *Col* 4:9<sup>11</sup>)
- 11=....was unprofitable to you...now is profitable to you and to me (Onesimus the runaway slave from you was not useful, but now he the faithful and beloved brother is useful for the body of Christ to us)
- 12= Q2....sending him back. You....receive him...my own heart (Paul is sending back Onesimus to Philemon. So, I am asking heartily you to accept him. We as the followers of Christ mark the forgiveness as God in Christ forgave us on the cross. We should forgive, up to that mark, as long as the Spirit in us works both to will and to do for His good pleasure, His glory or agape love sake. In verse 14, Paul asked Philemon's willing, cheerful, or voluntary forgiving Onesimus as a Christian brother. *Mat* 6:12; Eph 4:31-32; Luke 9:23; Phil 2:13; 2 Cor 9:7<sup>12</sup>)
- 13= ...I wished to keep with me...on your behalf ...minister to me in my chains for the gospel (Onesimus carried messages for Paul and took care of Paul's needs. So, I would like to have kept Onesimus so that he could, for your sake, minister to me in the bonds of the gospel)
- 14= ...without your consent....do nothing...your good deed ....not be by compulsion....voluntary[willingly] (Your forgiveness would be based upon willing, cheerful, voluntary heart, not forced, grudgingly, or of necessity as Paul suggests)
- 15=...perhaps....departed for a while for this purpose....you might receive him forever (After Onesimus ran away from you, he met Paul and he was saved. Now he is faithful and beloved brother to the body of Christ to us. For a while, it was the adverse circumstance. But God uses it and brings him to salvation through Paul at Rome. So perhaps this could be what God had purposed for His eternal purpose. *Rom* 8:28<sup>13</sup>)

to Me in heaven and on earth; *Mat 23:2, 11-12* saying: "The scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat.-<sup>11</sup> But he who is greatest among you shall be your servant. <sup>12</sup> And whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.

Rev 2:6 But this you have, that you hate the deeds of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.

<sup>18</sup> But if he has wronged you or owes anything, put that on my account.

<sup>19</sup> I, Paul, am <u>writing with my</u> <u>own hand</u>. I <u>will repay</u>—<u>not to</u> <u>mention</u> to you that <u>you owe me</u> 16=Q3 no longer as a slave....more than a slave- a beloved brother.....to me ....more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord (Paul humbly asks Philemon that Onesimus should be no longer merely a slave in the Rome's master-slave system "in the flesh" – today Employer-Employee system, but also a Christian brother – Paul, Onesimus, and Philemon are members of God's family, i.e., equal in Christ "in the Lord." Paul says to Philemon much more relationship between Onesimus and Philemon due to both brother relationship in the body of Christ and master-slave relationship in the world/flesh, than to Paul upon only the brother relationship in the Lord, as Paul persuades in other epistles *Col 3:9-11; 1 Cor 7:20-24; Eph 6:5-9; Col 4:1*14)

17= if...you count me as a partner, receive him as you would me (If you consider me as your partner or co-worker for the body of Christ, receive Onesimus as me – this is beautiful intercession on Paul's part; as we are in Christ Jesus, God made us accepted in the Beloved Son Jesus due to Jesus' intercession *Eph* 1:5-6<sup>15</sup>)

18= ...wrong you or owes anything, put that on my account (If any debt in Onesimus, charge it to me. It proves Paul's agape love to Onesimus. It would encourage and strengthen Onesimus to walk/live by faith. This kind of Paul's love is like Jesus the advocate, mediator, and intercessor against an accuser even if Satan tempts people day and night to accuse a saint. But the forgiven one is blessed like Onesimus 1 John 2:1; 1 Tim 2:5; Rom 8:34; Rev 12:10; Psalm 32:1-216)

19=....writing with my own hand....will repay-not to mention.... You owe me even your own self.....( Paul reiterates to repay any debt if it is. And he says a personal letter to Philemon, not mentioning the love debt which Philemon owed Paul who had preached the gospel of Jesus Christ to Philemon. This is humble but convincing letter – Note one duty of word ministers

<sup>14</sup> Col 3:9-11 Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds, <sup>10</sup> and have put on the new *man* who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him, <sup>11</sup> where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave *nor* free, but Christ *is* all and in all; 1 Cor 7:20-24 Let each one remain in the same calling in which he was called. <sup>21</sup> Were you called *while* a slave? - <sup>20</sup> Yes, brother, <u>let me have joy</u> <u>from you in the Lord; refresh my</u> heart in the Lord.
- <sup>21</sup> Having confidence in your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say. <sup>22</sup> But, meanwhile, also prepare a guest room for me, for I trust that through your prayers I shall be granted to you.
- <sup>23</sup> Epaphras, my fellow prisoner in Christ Jesus, greets you,
- <sup>24</sup> as do <u>Mark, Aristarchus, Demas, Luke,</u> my fellow laborers.
- <sup>25</sup> The <u>grace</u> of our Lord <u>Jesus</u> <u>Christ</u> be <u>with your spirit</u>. <u>Amen</u>.

- is to convince with to preach, rebuke, exhort and teach. Love debt is allowed but other money debt or surety is discouraged. Practically, the credit card debt should be managed wisely, not beyond paying ability, by a saint as a salt and light in the world 2 *Tim 4:2; Rom 13:8; Prov 6:1-5*<sup>17</sup>)
- 20=...let me have you from you in the Lord; refresh my heart in the Lord (Let you forgive Onesimus the run-away slave as a brother in the Lord, and then it would give Paul joy and would refresh Paul's heart in the Lord.)
- 21= ...confidence in your obedience...knowing ...even more that I say (It's a presumptive close. I trust you to obey my humble request and know you to do more than my request to Onesimus. Philemon might obey in full the teaching of Paul about master-slave relationship among Christians in other epistles in verse 16)
- 22=...meanwhile...prepare a guest room....I trust....through your prayers I shall be granted to you (it's a personal matter. I think I'm going to be released soon. I hope to be visiting you. Fix me a room. But the Bible didn't say whether or not Paul returned to Colossae)
- 23= Epaphras, my fellow prisoner in Christ Jesus greets... (Epaphras was the word minister at the Colossian church. He also once was a prisoner for Christ's sake like Paul, saluting Philemon *Col* 1:7<sup>18</sup>)
- 24= ...Mark, Aristarchus, Demas, Luke, my fellow laborers (John Mark the cousin of Barnabas joined in Paul's 1<sup>st</sup> mission trip and wrote the gospel of Mark. Aristarchus also once was a prisoner for Christ's sake. Luke as a physician wrote the books of Luke and Acts. Those were co-ministers with Paul except later Demas who forsook Paul in the last 2<sup>nd</sup> prison just before Paul' martyrdom *Col 4:10; Acts 12:25; Col 4:14; 2 Tim 4:10*<sup>19</sup>)
- 25=...grace of ...Jesus Christ...with your spirit. Amen (Paul says farewell. Christ's grace with Philemon's spirit, soul, mind, or heart. So be it)

Note: Most Christians say the Bible is important, but rarely study every word in the Bible and commit it to the Lord. So, it's better to study it and live accordingly after the Spirit for the Lord (2 Tim 2:15). This online word for global crusade in effect develops from the expositional sermon (KJV), into spiritual transformation in daily love fellowship with the Lord throughout the Bible Study (NKJV) -- All Scripture Expositional Study from verse by verse Inductive Studies -- of which application is the Discipleship and Spiritual Formation, closer to the image of Christ. We think that "Any human opinion is not really important rather than what God says. So, the best commentary on the Bible is the Bible per se. But the opinion to make us understand God's Word is acceptable (2 Corinthians 10:5)." Further, for the application, a life or spiritual experience might be helpful to understand how to apply an understood word in the text column, but it is

she would have her child back, and they could go home. She told those interrogating her that she knew who she, her husband, and her son belonged to and where they were going when they leave this temporal life. After a quiet and thoughtful pause, she said, "This physical life is temporal. Our life with Christ is eternal. My life without Jesus was empty. Now it's full."

When my team spoke to Alma, this was still fresh in her mind because it had recently happened. Miraculously, after being held for two weeks, they were released and able to flee Iran. As Alma's husband spoke, he said they do not want to focus on all the bad in their country toward Christians. They prefer to focus instead on all the good that God is doing throughout the Muslim world.

Muslims around the Middle East are experiencing Jesus in visions and dreams and coming to a radically transformative faith. As persecution increases, so do the opportunities to share Jesus with others. As a result, the underground church is also experiencing tremendous growth.

The team met with five underground pastors and ministry workers from Iran, who live at risk every single day. All five have already been arrested and imprisoned for their faith. Yet, their hardships have only increased their courage. They are working tirelessly to prepare and send out more missionaries across Muslim nations where foreign missionaries are not allowed. This is the reason Far Reaching Ministries (FRM) supports underground churches that have accepted the call.

Pastors in Islamic nations must teach their underground churches the advanced art of cyber security and hiding a person's digital identity. In Muslim countries where we are working, there are so-called Morality Police, who deploy teams to scour social media sites, wi-fi hotspots, and villages looking to penetrate underground church networks. These underground believers worship like no other that my team has experienced. The passion in their songs to Jesus floods the room with reverence and awe. They know absolute joy because they were raised in countries that leverage shame, fear, and violence to suppress the people. These hated and hunted Christians sing passionately, outstretching arms to heaven, dropping on their knees and faces.

A young, hip-looking guy picked up a guitar in an adjacent room where my team was having coffee. He began singing and playing the guitar beautifully on what everyone else had deemed broken and useless. He played so powerfully and passionately that everyone moved quietly and reverently into the room where he was. Watching him with his eyes closed, singing personally

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to Jesus, you could sense Christ was in the room with him. This young man was born in a radicalized Islamic country. He grew up knowing nothing about the world other than what he was taught in Islamic religious schools. As a young man, he did not have the same views as his hardliner teachers and relatives. He secretly resented Islam because it brought so much misery to his country. As a teenager, he saw what he describes as a "brilliant light and a man standing in my room with me." He said the man was very real and told him about Himself, Jesus the Christ. In an Islamic country, there are no obvious places to go to find out more about a Jewish Messiah named Jesus, so he went to his local mosque. He knew enough to know what happens to people accused of being Christians, so he decided to read the entire Koran to find Jesus for himself. After doing so, he knew that the Jesus he met in his bedroom was not anywhere in the Koran. Through a series of miracles, he found a Bible and began voraciously reading it. His faith exploded, and his boldness and courage increased. Five years after meeting Jesus, he has planted and currently helps support an underground network of churches spreading into several other Islamic nations. He, too, has the vision to send local missionaries across the entire Islamic world and out to the West.

My team spent additional time with underground doctors and pastors in other persecuted countries. Dr. Yusuf works among the poorest of the poor in his country. He sets up temporary medical clinics in remote villages and cares for patients all day and into the early morning hours. His team sleeps for a few hours before the process starts all over again. He treats numerous diseases and sees nothing but despair and hopelessness. He does this because he may be the only compassion these outcast people will ever experience. After caring so gently for the sick, he then tells the entire community
