- Q2. In 69:9, "Because zeal for Your house has eaten me up, And the reproaches of those who reproach You have fallen on me," explain what it means, with the verses cited in the New Testament. And how can we apply it to our lives?
- Q3. In 70:5, "But I am poor and needy; Make haste to me, O God! You are my help and my deliverer; O LORD, do not delay," explain it with the previous verse 4. And what can we learn from here?

### 68 To the chief Musicians. A Psalm and Song of David

<sup>1</sup>Let God arise, Let His enemies be scattered; Let those also who hate Him flee before Him. <sup>2</sup> As smoke is driven away,

So drive *them* away; As wax melts before the fire, *So* let the wicked perish at the presence of God.

<sup>3</sup> But let the righteous be glad; Let them rejoice before God;

Yes, let them rejoice exceedingly.

<sup>4</sup> Sing to God, sing praises to His name; Extol Him who rides on the clouds,

By His name YAH, And rejoice before Him.

<sup>5</sup> A father of the fatherless, a defender of widows, *Is* God in His holy habitation.

<sup>6</sup> God sets the solitary in families;

He brings out those who are bound into prosperity; But the rebellious dwell in a dry *land*.

<sup>7</sup>O God, when You went out before Your people, When You marched through the wilderness, *Selah* 

<sup>8</sup>The earth shook:

The heavens also dropped *rain* at the presence of God:

Sinai itself *was moved* at the presence of God, the God of Israel.

1-4= (The ark of the covenant was considered as the presence of God; It's like (1) Moses's saying to the many thousands of Israel who followed the ark, and His enemies were scattered and (2) David's joyfully bringing up the ark of the covenant from Obed-Edom house to Jerusalem with all the house of Israel with shouting and with the sound of trumpet; It seems many times in history that God allows evil to triumph in His longsuffering, but ultimately the triumph of God prevails in His time *Numbers* 10:35-36; 2 Sam 6:12-15<sup>1</sup>)

4= (God's name is YAHWEH, and here its shortened form is YAH)

5= (Here is the God of the humble, the God of the orphan, God of the poor, the God of the alien, the God of widows, the God of the least, the God of the oppressed; not God of the proud.)

8=(Mount Sinai was a reminder of (1) God's meeting Moses for Exodus from Egypt bondage and (2) God's given conditional promises and the 10 commandments through thunderings and lightnings, and a thick cloud over quaked Mount Sinai Ex 3:1-4; Ex 19:1-3, 16, 18<sup>2</sup>)

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Numbers 10:35-36 So it was, whenever the ark set out, that Moses said: "Rise up, O LORD! Let Your enemies be scattered, And let those who hate You flee before You." <sup>36</sup> And when it rested, he said: "Return, O LORD, *To* the many thousands of Israel."; 2 Sam 6:12-15 Now it was told King David, saying, "The LORD has blessed the house of Obed-Edom and all that *belongs* to him, because of the ark of God." So David went and brought up the ark of God from the house of Obed-Edom to the City of David with gladness. <sup>13</sup> And so it was, when those bearing the ark of the LORD had gone six paces, that he sacrificed oxen and fatted sheep. <sup>14</sup> Then David danced before the LORD with all *his* might; and David *was* wearing a linen ephod. <sup>15</sup> So David and all the house of Israel brought up the ark of the LORD with shouting and with the sound of the trumpet.

<sup>17</sup> The chariots of God *are* twenty thousand, *Even* thousands of thousands [even thousands of angels];

The Lord is among them as in Sinai, in the Holy *Place*.

You have ascended on high, You have led captivity captive; You have received gifts among men, Even from the rebellious, That the LORD God might dwell there.

<sup>19</sup> Blessed be the Lord, Who daily loads us with benefits, The God of our salvation! Selah 12= (God makes enemies flee away and let Israel divide the spoils taken from them)

14-16= (See the above map for Zalmon[Salmon], near to Shechem, Hermon, and Bashan the higher mountains than the Mount Zion -- near to the site of the ark in most holy place in the temple of God, the chosen place of God among His people --- where the Lord will dwell forever)

17=(KJV twenty thousand, even thousands of angels or NKJV twenty thousand, Even thousands of thousands - millions of angels, as John states "ten thousand times ten thousand, and thousands of thousands; Compared with the Mount Bashan, God chose Mount Sini in verse 8 and Mount Zion in verse 16, as David wrote poetically of the envy of the Mount Bashan *Rev* 5:113)

18=Q1 (God anointed Jesus the Messiah to proclaim liberty to the captives the believers who was dead, before seeing the 1<sup>st</sup> coming Messiah, in Abraham's bosom in Hades. While Jesus was dead for 3 days and 3 nights, Jesus proclaimed the gospel of Jesus the Messiah to the dead in Abraham's bosom of Hades, and upon His resurrection Jesus brought them up into the holy city in heaven. Now there is no Abraham's bosom in Hades but fiery place only. The ascended Christ has given the Holy Spirit and the various gifts of the Spirit to the saints in order to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ Isaiah 61:1; Luke 16:26; Heb 11:3; Acts 2:27; John 11:25; 1 Peter 4:6; Mat 27:52-53; Eph 4:8-12<sup>4</sup>)

24=(The Israelites saw and followed David's bringing the ark into the sanctuary in the temple of God, the procession. They would gather in Jerusalem for the feast day 3 times per year to worship God in the temple of God – The feast of Unleavened Bread just after the Passover, the Feast of Weeks or Pentecost or the firstfruits of wheats, and the Feast of Tabernacles or Succoth 2 Chron 8:13<sup>5</sup>)

28-30= (In the millennium kingdom age when Jesus is reigning on Mount Zion, the kings of the earth gather together and bring gifts and laying them before Him Heb 12:22<sup>6</sup>)

that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.; Acts 2:27 For You will not leave my soul in Hades, Nor will You allow Your Holy One to see corruption; John 11:25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live; 1 Peter 4:6 For this reason the gospel was preached also to those who are dead, that they might be judged according to men in the flesh, but live according to God in the spirit; Mat 27:52-53 and the graves were opened; and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised; <sup>53</sup> and coming out of the graves after His resurrection, they went into the holy city and appeared to many; Eph 4:8-12 Therefore He says: "When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, And gave gifts to men." <sup>9</sup> (Now this, "He ascended"—what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth? <sup>10</sup> He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) <sup>11</sup> And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, <sup>12</sup> for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ.

69 ("The Lilies [Shoshannim]" would be the name of the Chief Musician or of the worship team; Psalm 69 is the 2<sup>nd</sup> mostly cited in the New Testament after Psalm 22 mostly. It is a Messianic Psalm, a psalm of prophecy about the coming Messiah.)

3= (David cried for help in the overwhelming circumstances. We often think that God was too late to respond to us in many overwhelming tough circumstances; Like Jesus came into Bethany after Lazarus' death, although Martha like us said to Jesus who should have come earlier. However, God's time is perfect for His good purpose because He knows all consequences but we don't know them *John 11:21*7)

4= (to hate me without a cause was cited to Jesus hated without a cause by the people in NT *John 15:25*8)

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> John 11:21 Now Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>8</sup> John 15:25 But this happened that the word might be fulfilled which is written in their law, 'They hated Me without a cause.'

Let not those who seek You be confounded because of me, O God of Israel.

<sup>7</sup> Because for Your sake I have borne reproach;

Shame has covered my face.

<sup>8</sup>I have become a stranger to my brothers,

And an alien to my mother's children; <sup>9</sup> Because zeal for Your house has eaten me up,

And the reproaches of those who reproach You have fallen on me.

<sup>10</sup> When I wept *and chastened* my soul with fasting,

That became my reproach.

8=(David the youngest son of Jesse was anointed to be a king by God through Samuel even if Jesse and his brothers did not believe so; this verse was cited to Jesus the Messiah as His half-brothers did not believe in Him before His resurrection in NT 1 Sam 16:11-13; John 7:59)

9=Q2 (David's zeal for God's house caused him to prepare for the materials to build the temple of God during his life, even if he was not allowed by God. This verse was cited to Jesus the Messiah who drove out the sellers of oxen, sheep, and doves, and the money changers in the temple for His Father's house in NT; David bore the reproaches. The 2<sup>nd</sup> part of this verse was cited to Jesus the Messiah who did not please Himself but bore the sins of the world for salvation in NT. Note for Jesus' sake, those, who are reviled, persecuted, and accused falsely, are blessed because the reward in heaven is great *John 2:14-17; Rom 15:2-3; Mat 5:11-12*<sup>10</sup>)

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>9</sup> 1 Sam 16:11-13 And Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all the young men here?" Then he said, "There remains yet the youngest, and there he is, keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him. For we will not sit down till he comes here." <sup>12</sup> So he sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, with bright eyes, and goodlooking. And the LORD said, "Arise, anoint him; for this *is* the one!" <sup>13</sup> Then Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers; and the Spirit of the LORD came upon David from that day forward. So Samuel arose and went to Ramah; *John 7:5*For even His brothers did not believe in Him.

20= (Like Absalom and his followers against David, he composed his mind and heart in this verse. This verse was cited to Jesus the Messiah whose soul was exceedingly sorrowful, even to death, and took Peter, James, and John to Gethsemane and prayed to God the Father by himself. And He expected no doubt to receive someone to take pity, encouragement and strength. But there they were asleep. He woke them and said, 'Watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation. The Spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.' The two(2) times more He prayed by Himself at the Gethsemane, saying ,'the hour is at hand.' *Mat* 26:38-39,41, 45<sup>11</sup>)

21=(gall and vinegar this verse was cited to Jesus the Messiah who received sour wine and gall on the cross on the 4 books of the Gospel and said "it is finished" and He gave up His spirit on the book of John in NT Mat 27:34; Mark 15:23; Luke 23:36; John 19:28-30<sup>12</sup>)

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>11</sup> Mat 26:38-39,41, 45<sup>38</sup> Then He said to them, "My soul is exceedingly sorrowful, even to death. Stay here and watch with Me."<sup>39</sup> He went a little farther and fell on His face, and prayed, saying, "O My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will." <sup>41</sup> Watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation. The spirit indeed *is* willing, but the flesh *is* weak." <sup>45</sup> Then He came to His disciples and said to them, "Are *you* still sleeping and resting? 23=(David prayed to curse his enemies for an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth, to get even in OT. This verse was cited to Israelites the stumbled unbelievers, against Jesus the Messiah, who were replaced with the Gentiles for salvation in NT *Mat 5:38-39; Rom 11:9-*

25= (David's prayer to curse his enemies was cited to Judas Iscariot, the betrayer of Jesus the Messiah, whose office the apostle was taken by Matthias on the lot in NT *Acts* 1:20, 26<sup>14</sup>)

26=(This verse was cited to Jesus the Messiah, whom God allowed to strike and wound through Roman soldiers, to bear our griefs and our sorrows and our sins, as we esteemed or seriously regarded Him stricken, smitten by God in NT Isaiah 53:415)

27=(This verse was cited to His righteousness through faith in Jesus Christ imputing on me, not my own righteousness in NT *Phil* 3:9<sup>16</sup>)

28= (This verse was cited to any unbelievers not found written in the Book of Life to be cast into the lake of fire, the 2<sup>nd</sup> death in NT *Rev* 20:15<sup>17</sup>)

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>13</sup> Mat 5:38-39 "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' <sup>39</sup> But I tell you not to resist an evil person. Note: Most Christians say the Bible is important, but rarely study every word in the Bible and commit it to the Lord. So, it's better to study it and live accordingly after the Spirit for the Lord (2 Tim 2:15). This online word for global crusade in effect develops from the expositional sermon (KJV), into spiritual transformation in daily love fellowship with the Lord throughout the Bible Study (NKJV) -- All Scripture Expositional Study from verse by verse Inductive Studies -- of which application is the Discipleship and Spiritual Formation, closer to the image of Christ. We think that "Any human opinion is not really important rather than what God says. So, the best commentary on the Bible is the Bible per se. But the opinion to make us understand God's Word is acceptable (2 Corinthians 10:5)." Further, for the application, a life or spiritual experience might be helpful to understand how to apply an understood word in the text column, but it is temperately used like Paul, because nobody should think above that actual experience (2 Cor 12:6, Jer 23:28; Ne 8:8).

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"For I Consider that I am not at all inferior to the most eminent apostles. <sup>6</sup> Even though I am untrained in speech, yet I am not in knowledge. But we have been thoroughly manifested among you in all things" (2 Corinthians 11:5-6).
