Q1. In 32:15, "Until the Spirit is poured upon us from on high, And the wilderness becomes a fruitful field, And the fruitful field is counted as a forest," what does it mean? And what can we learn from here?

Q2. In 32:17, "The work of righteousness will be peace, And the effect of righteousness, quietness and assurance forever," what does it mean? And how can we apply it to our lives?

Q3. In 33:6, "Wisdom and knowledge will be the stability of your times, And the strength of salvation; The fear of the LORD *is* His treasure," what does it mean? And what can we learn from here?

(Background for context of this text on Daily Bible Reading and Studying Weekly Book Basis)

Isaiah 32 is about the reign of Christ in the millennium kingdom age. Isaiah 33 is directed against Assyria defeated by God in her attempt to conquer Jerusalem in similar to the last chapters 30-31. The 70<sup>th</sup> 7 years remain to be filled. That 7 year period will begin when God raptures the church. It will be a period when the Holy Spirit will be again working directly with the Jewish people in the Jewish nation. The end of that 7 years will end in a great tribulation. The last three and a half years, great tribulation, culminating in the battle of Armageddon when Jesus will come again with His church, and with His saints, to establish God's kingdom upon the earth. He will set His foot that day, on the mount of Olives. Jesus will reign there on mount Zion with us the all saints in our renewed bodies, our new bodies or glorified bodies with a rod of iron or the forced righteousness for a thousand years.

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Note: Most Christians say the Bible is important, but rarely study every word in the Bible and commit it to the Lord. So, it's better to study it and live accordingly after the Spirit for the Lord (2 Tim 2:15). This online word for global crusade in effect develops from the expositional sermon (KJV), into spiritual transformation in daily love fellowship with the Lord throughout the Bible Study (NKJV) -- *All Scripture Expositional Study from verse by verse Inductive Studies* -- of which application is the Discipleship and Spiritual Formation, closer to the image of Christ. We think that "Any human opinion is not really important rather than what God says. So, the best commentary on the Bible is the Bible per se. But the opinion to make us understand God's Word is acceptable (*2 Corinthians 10:5*)." Further, for the application, a life or spiritual experience might be helpful to understand how to apply an understood word in the text column, but it is temperately used like Paul, because nobody should think above that actual experience (2 Cor 12:6, Jer 23:28; Ne 8:8).

Dios te ama y permitió que su único hijo, Cristo, muriera en la cruz derramando su sangre por ti. b. Puente (1 Pedro 3:18a) "Pues también Cristo sufrió una vez por los pecados, el justo por los injustos, para llevarnos a Dios." En la muerte de Cristo, Él pagó la pena de muerte espiritual eterna por tus pecados. Así, Jesucristo hizo el puente entre tú (hombre) y Dios.

La respuesta del hombre Fe y vida eterna (Juan 3:16) "Porque de tal manera amó Dios al mundo, que ha dado a su Hijo unigénito, para que todo aquel que en él cree no se pierda, sino que tenga vida eterna." (Juan 5:24) "De cierto, de cierto les digo: El que oye mi palabra y cree al que me envió, tiene vida eterna y no será condenado, sino que ha pasado de muerte a vida." (1 Corintios 15:3-4) "Porque primeramente os he enseñado lo que asimismo recibí: Que Cristo murió por nuestros pecados, conforme a las Escrituras; que fue sepultado y que resucitó al tercer día, conforme a las Escrituras".
