Q1. In verse 1, "For behold, in those days and at that time, When I bring back the captives of Judah and Jerusalem," what does it mean in the context? And how can we apply it to our lives?

Q2. In verse 2, "I will also gather all nations, And bring them down to the Valley of Jehoshaphat; And I will enter into judgment with them there On account of My people, My heritage Israel, Whom they have scattered among the nations; They have also divided up My land," what does it mean in the context? And what can we learn from here?

Q3. In verse 21, "For I will acquit them of the guilt of bloodshed, whom I had not acquitted; For the LORD dwells in Zion," what does it mean in the context? And what can we learn from here? (Background for context of this text on Daily Bible Reading and Studying Weekly Book Basis)

While Elijah (875-850 BC) and Elisha (850-800 BC) prophesied to Israel around reigns of the family of Ahab the evil king, Joel (840-830BC) probably prophesied to Judah ultimately about the great tribulation, under the reign of Athaliah (841-835 BC) the Ahab's daughter in *2 Kings 11:1*, "When Athaliah the mother of Ahaziah saw that her son was dead, she arose and destroyed all the royal heirs." But upon her death, Jehoash(835-796BC) began to rule in the instruction of Jehoiada the priest in *2 Kings 11:21*, "Jehoash *was* seven years old when he became king."

Athaliah's father in law was Jehoshaphat the 4<sup>th</sup> good king of Judah, who had prayed for God in the invasion of enemies in 2 Chronicles 20:1-4, "It happened after this *that* the people of Moab with the people of Ammon, and *others* with them besides the Ammonites, came to battle against Jehoshaphat. <sup>2</sup>Then some came and told Jehoshaphat, saying, 'A great multitude is coming against you from beyond the sea, from Syria; and they are in Hazazon Tamar' (which *is* En Gedi). <sup>3</sup>And Jehoshaphat feared, and set himself to seek the LORD, and proclaimed a fast throughout all Judah. <sup>4</sup>So Judah gathered together to ask *help* from the LORD; and from all the cities of Judah they came to seek the LORD," to have been defeated by the Lord.

In the last time, in Joel 2:32, "And it shall come to pass *That* whoever calls on the name of the LORD Shall be saved. For in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there shall be deliverance, As the LORD has said, Among the remnant whom the LORD calls," The Lord puts the remnants Israelites in the safe place in the latter 3 ½ years in Revelation 12:6, "Then the woman fled into the wilderness, where she has a place prepared by God, that they should feed her there one thousand two hundred and sixty days."

Note: Most Christians say the Bible is important, but rarely study every word in the Bible and commit it to the Lord. So, it's better to study it and live accordingly after the Spirit for the Lord (2 Tim 2:15). This online word for global crusade in effect develops from the expositional sermon (KJV), into spiritual transformation in daily love fellowship with the Lord throughout the Bible Study (NKJV) -- *All Scripture Expositional Study from verse by verse Inductive Studies* -- of which application is the Discipleship and Spiritual Formation, closer to the image of Christ. We think that "Any human opinion is not really important rather than what God says. So, the best commentary on the Bible is the Bible per se. But the opinion to make us understand God's Word is acceptable (*2 Corinthians 10:5*)." Further, for the application, a life or spiritual experience might be helpful to understand how to apply an understood word in the text column, but it is temperately used like

## **KILLED IN THE SERVICE OF OUR LORD**

The first Sunday in November is the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church. Often, when I share that we have lost 71 men, I think many do not know how to process this and I am sure some doubt. But Far Reaching Ministries has a rich history of men who have valued the lives of others more than their own. I can remember one incident in particular where a soldier was badly wounded on the battlefield and could not walk. Two of our chaplains went out under heavy fire and dragged the man to safety. In the process, they were both mortally wounded and died. They fully knew that death for them meant eternity with Christ, but they knew the other man had not yet given his life to Christ so death would mean eternal separation. They chose to die so that others might live. Scripture says that no greater love than this that a man lay down his life for a friend. This man was not even a friend but a lost soul. I know that when they stood before the Lord they heard, well done my sons, well done. We have before you the photos of 61 who have given their lives, not all were shot but most were killed in combat.



## FREEDOM: 20 years of addiction; now Ali is leading others to freedom

Ali lived a lifestyle of crime and addiction for two decades. Then he met Jesus and his life was transformed. Ali has led more than thirty fellow Iranians to freedom in Christ.

Ali suffered with poor mental health from childhood. By the time he was an adolescent, the psychiatrists who were in charge of his care had all but given up hope of helping him.

Unable to engage with education, Ali fell in with the wrong crowd among whom he soon became addicted to drugs. For 20 years, Ali lived with this addiction and his lifestyle became marked by fist fights and knife crime. He had no hope that he would find freedom from the darkness in his life.

One day, Ali's felonies caught up with him and he was arrested. After completing a prison sentence, Ali's family insisted he attend a Narcotics Anonymous (NA) treatment camp. It was there that Ali became free from addiction, though his mental health remained poor.

Ali continued to attend regular NA meetings where he made a new friend, Behnam - a Christian. Over time, Behnam shared the Gospel and gave Ali a Bible. Deeply convicted by what he read in God's Word, as well as by the testimony of Behnam's life, Ali put his trust in Jesus.

"Since I believed in Jesus Christ, I have been healed spiritually and psychologically by the grace of Christ," reports Ali.

Ali soon showed himself to be a natural evangelist. Just four months after becoming a Christian, Ali started to share the Gospel with others. Since then, he has led more than 30 people to faith, many of whom also have a history of addiction.

Ali has grown in his faith through

a two-week discipleship course and is part of a house church which uses Elam's Weekly Fellowship resource to shape their meetings.

Ali is trusting God with the political uncertainty in Iran at this time: "I leave it in the hands of our Lord Jesus Christ," he says. Whatever the future holds, Ali is committed to serving those struggling with addiction so that they too may find true freedom.

Ali's story is remarkable but it is not unique: we hear many testimonies of people finding freedom from longcarried burdens when they surrender to Jesus. Please pray for Ali's continued growth in Christ and his ministry. Pray for many others trapped in addiction to find freedom in Christ.
